#### General Rules and Regulations.

- 1.—The Society shall be called "The Llanfair District Agricultural and Horticultural Society."
- 2.—The District shall comprise the following Parishes:—Llanfair, Llangyniew, Meifod, Pont Robert, Dolanog, Llanfibangel, Llanerfyl, Llangadfan, Garthbeibio, Llanllugan, Llanwyddelan, Manafon and Castle Caereinion.
- 3.—Except where otherwise specified, Exhibitors must reside within the Society's District.
  - 4.—The Committee shall appoint Judges, whose decisions shall be final,
- 5.—The Judges have power to withhold any Prize, if they should be opinion that there is not sufficient merit, or that the exhibit is not properly classed, or of granting only Second and Third Prizes to the exclusion of higher Prizes, where competing specimens do not appear to merit them and the number of entries is insufficient.
- 6.—No persons except those officially concerned will be allowed in the Show Tent during the time the awards are being made by the Judges.
- 7.—Should the total receipts be less than the expenditure, the committee shall have power to deduct a proportionate per centage from all ordinary money Prizes offered in the Schedule, sufficient to make up the deficiency.
- 8.—Objections to be laid before the Secretary in writing, within seven days from Show.
- 9.—The Prizes will be given to successful competitors on Saturday, August 26th, 1905, at the National School, Llanfair, from 3-30 to 5 pm. Prizes amounting to 5s. and upwards will be sent by post. The Committee desire that all cheques be cashed within two months of issue.
- 10.—Any Exhibitor obtaining a Prize fraudently, will forfeit the whole of the Prizes awarded to him, and be prohibited from exhibiting at any future Show of the Society.
- 11.—Each Subscriber will receive Two admission Tickets for a Subscription of 10s. 6d. or upwards, and such Tickets will be available for re-admission.
- 12.—Should any question arise, either upon the Rules and Regulations or any other matter connected with the Show, the same shall be referred to the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 13.—ALL ENTRIES CLOSE ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 5TH, and all fees must be paid at the time of entry.

- 14.—All Vegetables, Flowers, Fruit, and Farm produce shall be grown within the District by the Exhibitor, and all Dairy Produce, Poultry, Horses, Cattle, and Sheep shall be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor, and have been in his possession for at least three months prior to the Show.
- 15.—Every person in charge of Exhibits must obey the instructions of the Stewards or Secretaries, or otherwise be subject to disqualification and expulsion.
- 16.—The Names of all Exhibitors in Classes A. to F. will be kept strictly private, and no names will be made public except those of Exhibitors who win prizes.
- 17.—The Committee shall have power to decide in what class an intending Exhibitor is entitled to compete, to refuse an Entry, or to cancel any Entry made, and no Exhibitor can Exhibit for the same Entry in Classes A., B. and E., and no Exhibitor can take more than one prize for the same kind of Exhibit in Classes A. to F., with the exception of Class C.
- 18.—The Committee reserve to themselves the right to inspect any Exhibitors garden, and any Exhibitor found transgressing any of the Society's Rules and Regulations shall be disqualified from receiving any of the Prizes offered.
- 19.—Any Exhibitor, Classes A. to F., attaching his or her name or any name or mark on a cloth, card, or anything of the kind will be disqualified.
- 20.—Fruit and Vegetables must be shown on plates, dishes or trays, provided by the Exhibitors.
- 21.—Fruit, Flowers, and Vegetables shall be dressed before being admitted to the Show. All pots must be properly cleaned and covered with fresh earth or moss, and the names of all plants to be affixed as far as possible.
- 22.—The Committee do not hold themselves responsible for any damage done to the Exhibits, but all possible care will be taken of them.
- 23.—The arrangements of the Exhibits will be made by the Stewards appointed by the Committee, neither may the Judges or any other person be present at the arrangement.
- 24.—No Exhibitor shall be allowed to act as Steward in any Class in which he has an Entry.
- 25.—In Class A all Entries shall be free. In Classes B., D., E., F. and G., an Entrance Fee of 3d. shall be charged for each Exhibit, or One Shilling and Sixpence for all Exhibits in each Class. But a subscription of Five Shillings or more to the funds of the Society shall cover all Entries made in these Classes by the Subscriber
- 26.—In Class C an Entrance Fee of Fourpence shall be charged for each Exhibit, or an Entrance Fee of Five Shillings will cover all Entries made in this Class.
- 27.—Any gentleman's gardener exhibiting his employer's produce must enter such Exhibit in his employer's name, but when exhibiting his own produce in his own name he is subject to Rule 26.

- 28.—In Class G all Local Exhibits must have been reared within the District. Professional Breeders are excluded from exhibiting in the Local Class.
- 29.—Each Exhibitor must send with each Exhibit an envelope bearing the name of the Exhibit, and having the name and address of the Exhibitor enclosed. Envelopes and Entry Forms may be obtained from the Secretary.
- 30.—All Articles for Exhibition in Class A, B, D, E and F must be delivered at the gate of the Show Ground on Thursday, AUGUST 17th, 1905, from 6 to 8-30 a.m. It must be clearly understood that no Exhibits for Competition in these Classes can be received after 8-30 a.m. on the Show morning. Exhibitors in Class C, however, will be allowed until 9-30 a.m.
- 31.—No 'Fent Exhibit must be removed after the close of the Show at 7 p.m. At that hour a bell will be rung, the tent cleared, and admittance will only be granted to those producing "Removal Tickets."
- 32.—No account against the Society will be recognised unless authorised by the Secretary in writing, and all bills must be rendered within three weeks from the date of the Show.

#### Horses.

- 33.—An Entrance Fee of 2s 6d shall be charged for each Exhibit.
- 34.—All Horses to be on the Show Ground by 10-30 a.m., and no horse will be admitted after that hour. The horses will be allowed to leave the field at 4 p.m.
- 35.—Horses competing in the Trotting and Turn-outs will come on the Show Ground at the time specified on the day programmes, but horses already on the ground may, by written permission from the Secretaries, leave the ground to prepare for competition in the Trotting and Turn-out Classes.
- 36.—Each Horse must have an attendant during the judging, and all Cobs and Ponies must be ridden, except where otherwise specified in Schedule.
- 37.—No horse to compete in a Class in which it has previously taken a first prize at the Society's Show.
  - 38.—All Horses will be paraded around the Show ring prior to leaving the ground.

#### Cattle.

- 39.—An Entrance Fee of 2s. will be charged for each Exhibit in these Classes.
- 40.—Each Bull, Cow, Heifer and Bullocks must have an attendant while on the Show Ground.
- 41.—All Cattle must be on the Show Ground by 10-30 a.m., and no animal will be admitted after that hour. The Cattle will leave the field at 4 p.m.

#### Sheep.

- 42.-An Entrance Fee of 2s. will be charge for each Exhibit, and 6d. for rams.
- 43.—All Sheep must be on the ground by 10-30 a.m., and no Exhibits in this Class will be received after that hour, and must not be removed before 4 p.m.
