

### General Rules and Regulations.

- 1. The Society shall be called "The Llanfair District Agricultural and Horticultural Society."
- The District shall comprise the following parishes:—Llanfair, Llangyniew, Meifod, Pont Robert, Dolanog, Llanfihangel, Llanerfyl, Llangadfan, Garthbeibio, Llanllugan, Llanwyddelan, Manafon and Castle Caereinion.
- Management.—That the Officers of the Society shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Auditors, Hon. Vet. Surgeon and Secretary. Such Officers to be ex-officio members of the General Committee.
- 4. The business of the Society shall be controlled by a Committee to be called "The General Committee," to be appointed at the Annual Meeting. Such meeting to be held in October. The Committee to consist of 48 members. Siz members to form a quorum. The Committee may delegate administrative powers to Sub-committees.
- 5. Subscribers.—That Subscribers of £1 1s. and upwards be Vice-presidents of the Society; and that all Subscribers be members of the Society. Each Subscriber will receive Two Admission Tickets for a suscription of 10s. 6d. and upwards. That all subscriptions be considered due 1st July in each year.

### Horticultural Section.

6. That Exhibitors be divided in the following Divisions.

Division 1.—For Cottagers only. Rental not to exceed £8 per annum.

- " 2.—Amateurs not regularly employing professional assistance.
- 3. Open to all (in or outside the district).
- , 4.—Open to Farmers of the District.
- Conditions.—Except where otherwise specified, Exhibitors must reside within the Society's District.
  - (a) All Vegetables, Flowers, Fruit, and Farm Produce shall be grown within the District by the Exhibitor, and shall be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor, and have been in his or her possession for at least three months prior to the Show (wild flowers and grasses excepted).
  - (b) The Committee reserve to themselxes the right to inspect any Exhibitor's Garden, and any Exhibitor found transgressing any of the Society's Rules and Regulations shall be disqualified from receiving any of the Prizes offered

- (c) The Committee shall have power to decide in what Division an intending Exhibitor is entitled to compete, to refuse an Entry, or to cancel any Entry made, and no Exhibitor will be allowed to compete in any other Division than his own, but all Exhibitors can compete in the Open Division on Payment of Entry Fees charged for that Division.
- (d) The Names of all Exhibitors in Divisions 1 to 4 will be kept strictly private, and no names will be made public except those of Exhibitors who win prizes.
- (e) Any Exhibitor, Divisions 1 to 4, attaching his or her name or any name or mark on a cloth, card, or anything of the kind will be disqualified.
- (f) Fruit and Vegetables must be shown on plates, dishes or trays, provided by the Exhibitors.
- (g) Fruit, Flowers, and Vegetables shall be dressed before being admitted to the Show. All pots must be properly cleaned and covered with fresh earth or moss, and the names of all plants to be affixed as far as possible.
- (h) The Committee do not hold themselves responsible for any damage done to the Exhibits, but all possible care will be taken of them.
- (i) The arrangements of the Exhibits will be made by the Stewards appointed by the Committee, neither may the Judges or any other person be present at the arrangement (collections excepted).
- (j) No Exhibitor shall be allowed to act as Steward in any Division in which he has an Entry, and no person except those officially concerned will be allowed in the Show Tent during the time the awards are being made by the Judges.
- (k) Every person in charge of Exhibits must obey the instructions of the Stewards or Secretaries, or otherwise be subject to disqualication and expulsion.
- (1) Each Exhibitor must send with each Exhibit an envelope bearing the name of the Exhibit, and having the name and actress of the Exhibitor enclosed. Envelopes and Entry Forms hay be obtained from the Secretary.

8. Entrance Fees.—(a) Division (1) 2d. each entry or 1/6 for all entries or 2/- do. do.

- (3) 4d. or 5/do. do. do. ,, (4) 3d. do. or 2/do. do. ,, (5) (Poultry) 6d. or 2/do.
- (b) Any gentleman's gardener exhibiting his employer's produce must enter such Exhibit in his Employer's name, but when exhibiting his own produce in his own name he must enter in Division 3.

- 9. Delivery and Removals of Exhibits.—(a) All Articles for Exhibition in Divisions 1, 2 and 4 must be delivered at the gate of the Show Ground on Thursday, AUGUST 12th, 1909, from 6 to 8-30 a.m. It must be clearly understood that no Exhibits for Competition in these Divisions can be received after 8-30 a.m. on the Show morning. Exhibitors in Diuision 3, however, will be allowed until 9-30 a.m.
  - (b) No Tent Exhibit must be removed until after the close of the Show at 7 p.m. At that hour a bell will be rung, the tent cleared, and admittance will only be granted to those producing "Removal Tickets."

### Poultry.

- Local Classes.—All Local Exhibits must have been reared within the District. Professional Breeders are excluded from exhibiting in the Local Classes.
  - An Entrance Fee of 6d. shall be charged for each Exhibit, or Two Shillings to cover all entries in this division.

### Agricultural Section.

All Poultry, Horses, Cattle and Sheep shall be the bona-fid-property of the Exhibitor, and have been in his or her possession for at least three months prior to the Show.

11. Horses.—(a) An Entrance Fee of 2/6 shall be charged for each Exhibit

(specials excepted).

- (b) Horses competing in the Trotting and Turnouts will come on the Show Ground at the time specified on the day programmes, but Horses already on the Ground may, by written permission from the Secretary, leave the Ground to prepare for competition in the Trotting and Turn-out Classes.
- (c) Each Horse must have an attendant during the judging, and all Cobs and Ponies must be ridden, except where otherwise specified in Schedule.
- (d) That owners refrain where possible, from leading their Horses during judging.

### TROTTING RULES.

(c) The following Rules will be strictly enforced:-

1.—If a horse breakes it must be pulled up as soon as possible.
2.—Any horse gaining ground on the gallop will be disqualified.

 Any horseman fouling or putting his horse in the way of a competitor will be disqualified.

4.—No norse can win on the gallop.

- (f) All Horses will be paraded around the Show ring prior to leaving the ground.
- 12. Cattle.—An Entrance Fee of 2/6 will be charged for each Exhibit in these Classes (specials excepted). Each Bull, Cow, Heifer and Bullocks must have an attendant while on the Show Ground.

Sheep.—An entrance Fec of 2/- will be charged for each Exhibit, and 1/for Rams (specials excepted.



All Horses, Cattle and Sheep to be on the Show Ground not later than 10-30 a.m. on the Show Day, and no animal will be admitted after that hour. Horses entered for Trotting and Turn-Outs excepted.

### IMPORTANT.

No Animal to compete in a Class in which it has previously taken a first prize at the Society's Show. Cups included.

### Additional Rules.

### INDUSTRIAL SECTION-

All Classes in this Section are open unless otherwise stated.

- 1. Entries in every class will close on August 7th.
- Exhibit must be bona-fide the property and the unaided work of the Exhibitor. This rule will be strictly enforced. Any Exhibitor intringing this Rule will be disqualified, and all prize-money forfeited.
- The Committee will take every care of articles sent for Fxhibition, but cannot be responsible for any loss or damage which may happen to any article.
- 4. The Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the Committee, who reserve the right to withdraw any Prize in the event of there not being sufficient competition or otherewise at their absolute discretion.
- No Exhibit that has taken a prize in previous years must be entered for competition.
- All Exhibits for comp t tion in this section must be delivered to the stewards not later than 9-30 a.m.

### General Rules.

- 1. The Committee shall appoint Judges, whose decisions shall be final.
- 2. The Judges have power, in the event of an Exhibitor being awarded more than one Prize in a Class, to re-award the Prize to the next best Exhibitor in merit.

- 3. That a Competitor with more than one entry in a Class and awarded two prizes be only entitled to one, this to apply to all Classes in the Horticultural Section.
- 4. Second Prize to be withheld unless there be 3 or more entries. The above to apply to Horticulture and Agriculture.
- Any Exhibitor obtaining a Prize fraudulently will forfeit the whole of the Prizes awarded to him, and be prohibited from Exhibiting at any fiture Show of the Society.
- 6. Objections to be laid before the Secretary in writing, within three days from Show, but in the event of the objection being as to the height of any animal, it must be lodged with the Secretary before the animal leaves the ground.
- 7. Should any objection arise, ifther up in the Rules and Regulations or any other matter connected with the Show, the same shall be referred to the Evecutive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 8. No account against the Society will be recognised unless authorised by the Secretary in writing, and all bills must be rendered within three weeks from the date of the Show.
- Should the total receipts be less than the expenditure, the Committee shall
  have power to deduct a proportion to per centage from all ordinary
  money Prizes offered in the Schedule, sufficient to make up the deficiency.




